Direct participation and involvment of young people

Civic Identity of Young People

- Definition of politics complex and unclear itself
- Politics & Young people ambiguious relationship
- Missing sense of coherence between policy and politics Social, cultural and geographic affiliations more relevant

Young people's feeling towards Politics: Scepticism and lack of knowledge

Principles of effective youth participation

- 1. Choise of involvement
- 2. Age/Youth-Appropriate Activities
- 3. Adequate ressources
- 4. Sucessful communication
- 5. Empowerment
- 6. Review & Reflection

Range of Youth Participation

- 1. Open activities
- 2. Project orientated participation
- 3. Direct contact/structured dialog with politicians
- 4. Youth consultation in adult bodies
- 5. Representative participation
- ⇒ Mutual impact of format and the intended aim


Rationale of Youth Participation

Impact through

- Representation/ Advocacy
 - > overtaking young people's case
- Information/ Consultation
 - > get young people's views in
- Integration/ Co-determination
 - > get young people actively involved
