How much has Europe changed in the past decade through the impact of terrorism?

- Terrorism is perceived as a common risk by all member states and the European public
- Terrorism is primarily regarded as topic for domestic (or for that matter inner-European) security
- Terrorism as a risk-multiplier, internalised in security political thinking and public discourse
- Through its activity in the field of counter-terrorism the European Union actually constitutes itself as a political actor



How can the West win the 'War of Ideas' and gain the support of public opinion in the Middle East?

- A 'war of ideas' between the 'West' and 'Islam'? Rather a discourse within Islam about adequate interpretation of Quran, religious duties etc. (similar to other inner-religious discourses)
- Middle Eastern public opinion about the West
- > Reflecting on Western policy vis-à-vis the Middle East
- ➤ Addressing the anti-Western narrative in the Middle East
- Addressing anti-Islam sentiments in the West
